All the developments identified in there have now been built and as there is still a housing need in North Warwickshire, we need to review this plan in order to ensure that we have a say in the developments happening in our village.

The Plan has been instrumental in contributing the declining of a recent proposed development, that many residents had objected to, as it did not sit within the objectives defined in the plan so it is imperative that we keep this up to date to ensure it is still classed as relevant by both Planners and potential developers alike.

What is a Neighbourhood Plan?

Neighbourhood planning is a new way for communities to have a say in the future of the places where they live and work. It gives you the power to produce a plan with real legal weight that directs development in your local area. It helps you:

- Choose where you want new homes, shops and offices to be built
- Have your say on what those new buildings should look like
- Grant planning permission for the new buildings you want to see go ahead
- Groups can get tailored advice, support and grants to develop their neighbourhood plans.

We will prepare a trail so everyone can enjoy each other's efforts and hopefully, there will be Christmas cards available next year portraying this year's creations.



St Nicholas Church's stone boundary walls are crumbling!

It might not look a lot, but the wall that holds the churchyard is failing. The lime mortar, which only has a limited life is crumbling and washing away.

The Church and Churchyard is part of the charm of our village and because of its heritage - its been here longer than any of us - it is a specialist job and needs to be repaired with the correct materials to minimise any future damage.

For safety reasons, some of the stones have already been removed for safety reasons, and will be replaced when the wall is refurbished.

The renovation means that some of the wall will need to be taken down and rebuilt, whilst some will just need repointing. The costs are currently in the region of £28000.

Fundraising has begun, with coffee mornings, guizzes, and grant applications. Our aim is to sensitively rebuild and restore these walls to ensure they are safe and solid for centuries to come. As a small congregation we cannot do this alone, we need your help to raise the necessary funds to repair the wall.

So what would it take? Coffee mornings, concerts, sponsored events, but by far the quickest and easiest way would be if each household (300+) in the village donated an average of £75, and some of it be gift aided. Then the wall could be repaired. If you are eligible to Gift Aid it enables us to claim an additional 25% on top of your donation from the Government.

We recognise finances are tighter for everyone, but can you help by making a donation? **Anything** you give will make a difference.

Warks. Road Safety Partnership supports use of What3words App

Warwickshire Road Safety Partnership is launching an online campaign to raise awareness of 'What3Words' in a bid to get more residents in Warwickshire using the app to provide emergency services with the location of a collision or emergency.

What3words has divided the world into 3 metre squares and given each square a unique combination of three words - what3words address.

In an emergency, callers can give the call handler the three words to help dispatch emergency services to the precise location.

This is even more important in rural locations where it's more difficult to communicate location accurately, enabling responders to get resources to the scene as quickly as possible.

To report an emergency, always call 999. If a collision has occurred which does not require an immediate response, it can be reported online.
